□ 57 schools returning data to the DfE (43 primaries, 10 secondary, 1 PRU and 3 specials)
□ 100% of schools automatically pull into our Capita system
□ Both sets of data do contain some inaccuracies
□ National Attendance Rate 91.7% (Redcar and Cleveland 91%)
□ National PA 20.2% (Redcar and Cleveland 22%)
□ 93.6% in state-funded primary schools (Redcar and Cleveland 92.8%)
□ 89.4% in state-funded secondary schools (Redcar and Cleveland 89%)

86.1% in state-funded special schools (Redcar and Cleveland 87.2%)

SEND



Pupils with SEN support needs (non-EHCP) are more likely to be PA or SA from school. Of those who were PA or SA in Spring Term:

- 19% of those PA and 27% of those SA in primary school were SEN K
- ☐ 22% of those PA and 32% of those SA in secondary school were SEN K
- ☐ 34% of those PA and 37% of those SA in our PRU were SEN K

EHCP

- 4% of those PA and 11% of those SA in primary school had an EHCP
- 4% of those PA and 6% of those SA in secondary school were EHCP
- 8% of those PA and 7% of those SA in our PRU were EHCP



Poverty

Pupils who are receiving free school meals are more likely to be PA or SA from school.

- □ 41% of those PA and 48% of those SA in primary school are receiving FSM
- □ 53% of those PA and 64% of those SA in secondary school are receiving FSM
- 57% of those PA and 79% of those SA in special school are receiving FSM
- □ 76% of those PA and 76% of those SA in the PRU are receiving FSM






- □ Primary PA N2 18%, R 13% Av 10% across Year 1 to 6, lowest year 3 at 8% but lowest pupil numbers
- ☐ Primary SA N2 21%, R 13% Year 5 highest at 13%, lowest year 3 at 4%
- □ Secondary PA Year 7 (17%) Av 21% Year 8-10, Year 11 (18%)
- ☐ Secondary SA Year 7 (10%) Av 22% Year 8-11, Year 10 (25%)
- ☐ Special PA Average 6% Year 1 to 5, rising to 10% in Year 6, with Year
- 11 highest at 12%
- □ Special SA Highest Year 9 at 25%, Year 10-11 (18%) and Year 6 (14%)
- □ PRU PA Highest Year 9 (24%), 10 (33%) and 11 (36%) and same for SA Year 9 (22%), 10 (27%) and Year 11 (44%)

Primary – percentage of those who were PA or SA in Spring Term by year group




Primary School PA/SA Year chart
